A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH THE JOINT FRIENDSHIP AGREEMENT COMMITTEE WITHIN THE TOWN OF BLACK DIAMOND, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA.

**WHEREAS** Section 145 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A. 2000, Chapter M-26, as amended provides that Council may pass bylaws to establish Committees of Council and delegate to such Committees certain duties and powers imposed and conferred upon a Council by the said *Municipal Government Act*;

**AND WHEREAS** the Municipal Councils of the Towns of Turner Valley and Black Diamond delegate their powers, duties or functions to the Committee as established in Section 203(1)(2) and (3) of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A. 2000, Chapter M-26 as amended;

**AND WHEREAS** the municipal Councils of the Towns of Turner Valley and Black Diamond entered into the Friendship Agreement recognizing the value of ongoing communication between the two municipalities and the importance of having a mechanism to discuss matters of mutual interest and opportunities;

**AND WHEREAS** the municipal Councils of the Town of Turner Valley and the Town of Black Diamond wish to establish a joint Council Committee to facilitate this joint communication and information sharing;

**AND WHEREAS** the municipal Councils have agreed on the form of and functions for this Committee;

**AND WHEREAS** to bring the joint Council Committee into existence as a joint Committee of the two municipalities both municipal Councils must pass a bylaw to establish the joint Committee;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of Black Diamond hereby establishes the Joint Friendship Agreement Committee with the duties of the Committee as set out in the Friendship Agreement and the Terms of Reference attached to and forming part of this bylaw.

#### 1. TITLE

1.1. This Bylaw may be cited as the "Joint Friendship Agreement Committee Bylaw".

## 2. **DEFINITIONS**

- **2.1.** In this bylaw:
  - **2.1.1.** "Act" means the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000 M-26, as amended.

- **2.1.2.** "Administration" means the staff of the Towns of Turner Valley and Black Diamond, under the direction of their respective Chief Administrative Officers.
- **2.1.3.** "Administrative Support" refers to the Administration resource person appointed to a Committee by the Chief Administrative Officer or their delegate.
- **2.1.4.** "Chief Administrative Officer" of "CAO" means the Chief Administrator established by Council.
- 2.1.5. "Code of Conduct" means the Black Diamond Code of Conduct Bylaw 17-13, which establishes the conduct governing councillors and Members of Council Committees.
- **2.1.6.** "Committee" means the Town of Turner Valley and Town of Black Diamond Joint Friendship Agreement Committee.
- **2.1.7.** "Council" means the municipal Council of Turner Valley and Black Diamond:
- 2.1.8. "Joint Consideration Document" means a written description of a municipality's joint challenge or opportunity, including request(s) of the other municipality which will include a clearly defined joint opportunity or issue description and background information, implications of request(s), and additional documentation.
- **2.1.9.** "Member" means a Council Member of the Towns of Turner Valley and Black Diamond.
- **2.1.10.** "Subcommittee" means a Subcommittee established to assist with the duties of a Board or Committee.
- **2.1.11.** "Towns" means the Town of Turner Valley and the Town of Black Diamond as municipal corporations.
- **2.1.12.** "Terms of Reference" means a Terms of Reference approved by Council that establishes the functions, procedures, membership, and other governance characteristics of a Committee.

#### 3. MEMBERSHIP

**3.1.** The Committee shall consist of all the Members of the Councils of the Town of Turner Valley and the Town of Black Diamond.

#### 4. COMMITTEE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- **4.1.** The Friendship Agreement will be the governing document to the Committee.
- **4.2.** The Terms of Reference attached to and forming part of this bylaw establishes the procedures and other governance characteristics of this Committee.

## 5. CODE OF CONDUCT

**5.1.** The Committee Members will govern themselves in accordance to their respective Code of Conduct Bylaw.

#### 6. BUDGET AND REMUNERATION

- **6.1.** The Joint Friendship Agreement Committee may have the budgets and resources established in the Operating Budget of the Town of Black Diamond as approved by Council.
- **6.2.** Council Members are remunerated in accordance with their respective remuneration policies as amended from time to time, unless the Terms of Reference provides for otherwise.

## 7. CONFLICT RESOLUTION

**7.1.** If conflict occurs, the conflict resolution protocols of the Friendship Agreement shall be followed.

#### 8. SEVERABILITY

**8.1.** Each provision of this Bylaw is independent of all other provisions. If a provision of this Bylaw is declared invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of the Bylaw will remain valid and enforceable.

#### 9. EFFECTIVE DATE

**9.1.** This Bylaw will take force and effect upon third and final reading and signing thereof.

1	NAME	<ul> <li>a) Joint Friendship Agreement Committee (JFAC) – attached to and forming part of the Joint Friendship Agreement Committee Bylaw.</li> </ul>
2	GENERAL PURPOSE	a) The aim of the JFAC meetings is to provide a forum to ensure Councils and staff of both communities continue to comply with the Friendship Agreement. The Friendship Agreement outlines the commitment of both Turner Valley and Black Diamond to work collaboratively keeping each other informed of strategic changes, and to explore collaboration opportunities.
3	MEMBERSHIP	a) Both Turner Valley and Black Diamond Councils of a whole.
4	GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE	a) The Friendship Agreement shall be the governing document to the Joint Friendship Agreement Committee.
		b) The Mayor, or in the absence of the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor, of each hosting municipality shall act as Chair.
		c) The CAO's will serve as administrative advisors to the JFAC. Other administrative staff will assist the Committee as required, at the discretion of the CAO's.
		d) The Councils of Black Diamond and Turner Valley delegate all of its powers, duties and functions by enactment of the Joint Friendship Agreement Committee Bylaw to the Committee in accordance to s. 203(1)(2) and (3) of the <i>Municipal Government Act</i> .
5	MEETINGS	a) The meetings of the Committee will be held in public unless otherwise authorized by the Act.
		b) Each Council Member of Black Diamond and Turner Valley is appointed to and expected to attend the JFAC meetings.
		c) A quorum of the Committee will be eight (8) Members and must include a minimum of four (4) representatives from each municipality.
		d) JFAC meetings will occur not less than twice per year. Special meetings of the Committee may occur at any time upon consensus agreement of the Council of the Town of Turner Valley and the Council of Black Diamond.
		e) The host municipality will prepare and distribute meeting minutes. The host shall circulate the meeting minutes to their respective counterparts for further comment and recirculation within ten days of the completion of the meeting. Upon the JFAC membership signing off on the meeting minutes, they shall then be sent to be ratified by each respective Council at their next available business meeting.
